Distance to the Festival: Duck Creek Village to Cedar City is approximately 31 miles, taking around 45 minutes by car.

Bryce Canyon National Park

About 1.5 hours from Cedar City, known for its unique rock formations called hoodoos.



Day 1: Arrival and Festival Kickoff

Morning:

- 8:00 AM: Depart from Duck Creek Village.
- **8:45 AM:** Arrive in Cedar City and check into your accommodation.
- **10:00 AM:** Visit the Southern Utah Museum of Art (SUMA). It's located on the Southern Utah University (SUU) campus, close to the festival venues.
- **11:30 AM:** Lunch at <u>The Grind Coffeehouse</u>, a local favorite for sandwiches and salads.

Afternoon:

- **1:00 PM:** Guided tour of the festival grounds, including the Engelstad Shakespeare Theatre and the Eileen and Allen Anes Studio Theatre.
- **3:00 PM:** Attend a backstage tour for a behind-the-scenes look at the festival preparations.

Evening:

- **5:00 PM:** Dinner at <u>Centro Woodfired Pizzeria</u>, known for its delicious pizzas and cozy atmosphere.
- **7:00 PM:** Attend the evening performance at the Engelstad Shakespeare Theatre. Check the festival schedule for specific plays.



Zion National Park

Around 1 hour from Cedar City, famous for its spectacular canyons and hiking trails.



Kolob Canyons

Part of Zion National Park, closer to Cedar City, offers beautiful vistas and less crowded trails.

- 10:00 AM: Drive to Cedar Breaks
 National Monument (about 30 minutes from Cedar City). Enjoy hiking and breathtaking views of the Red Rock Amphitheater.

- **12:30 PM:** Return to Cedar City for lunch at <u>The French Spot</u>, a charming café with French cuisine.
- **2:00 PM:** Attend a matinee perforance at the Randall L. Jones Theatre.
- 4:30 PM: Participate in a play orientation or literary seminar to gain insights into the evening's perfomance.

Evening:

- **6:00 PM:** Dinner at <u>Chef Alfredo</u> Ristorante Italiano
- **8:00 PM:** Attend the evening performance at the Engelstad Shakespeare Theatre.

- **10:00 AM:** Visit the Frontier Homestead State Park Museum to learn about the history of the area.

- **7:00 PM:** Final evening performance at the Engelstad Shakespeare Theatre.
